The Protective Behaviors training material is a critical tool for protecting Special Olympics athletes from sexual, physical, and emotional abuse. The Protective Behaviors training is required of all Class A Volunteers (Class A Volunteers as defined in the Special Olympics US Volunteer Screening Policy) and staff members. It must be completed to be eligible to volunteer as a class A volunteer for Special Olympics Alaska. Class A volunteers are required to take the training every three years.
